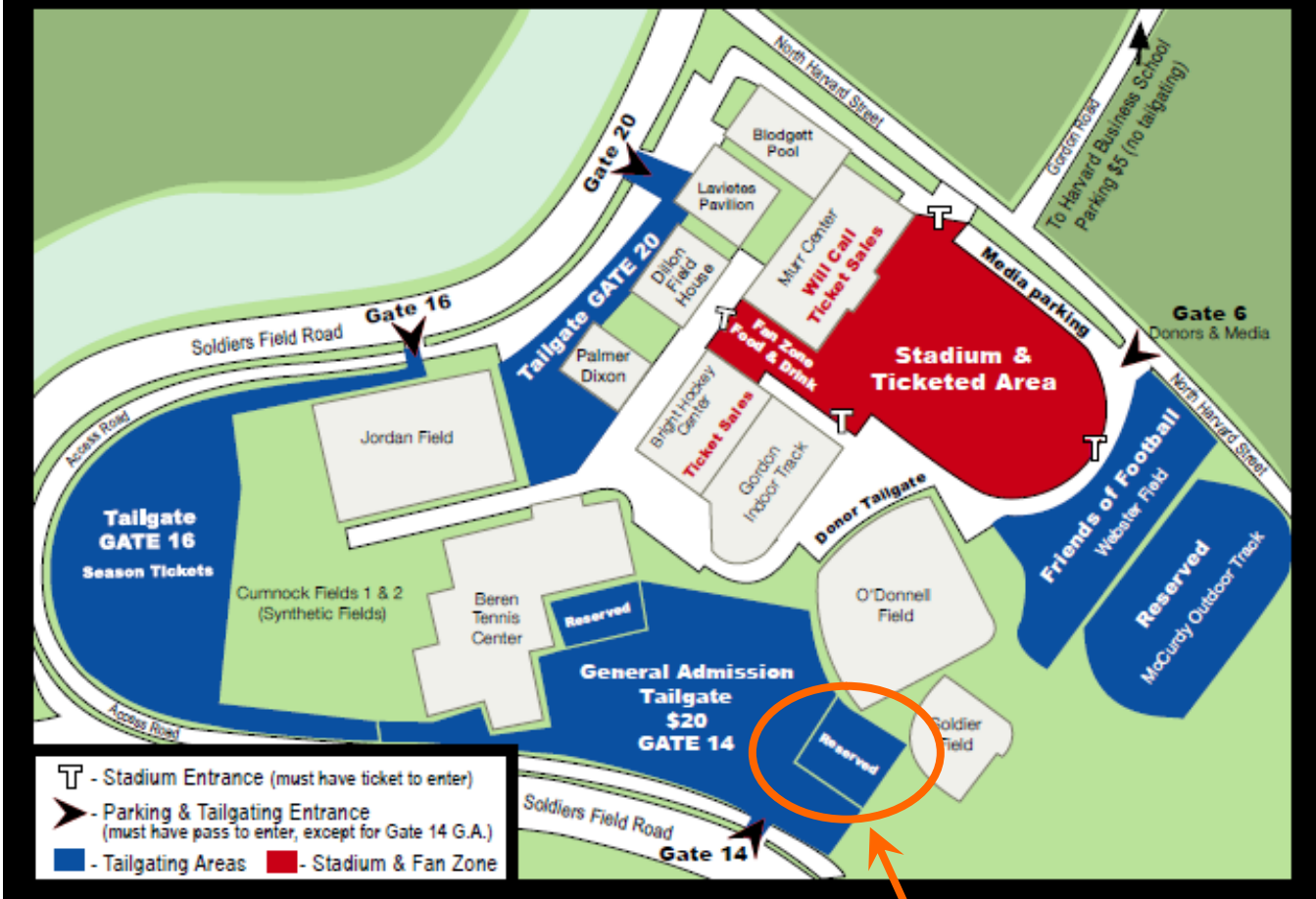

IMPORTANT: New Game Day Policies in Place at Harvard for 2009!

Starting in 2008, a strictly-enforced game day policy was initiated at Harvard. The Princeton Association of New England requires all attendees of the Oct 24 events to fully cooperate with this policy. We encourage you to review the full policy below, and highlight for you three major changes from past years:

1. **The Tiger Tent may only stay open for two hours before and two hours after the football game.**
2. **Ticket holders will be asked to move into the game at kickoff. Non-ticket holders will be asked to leave the premises by security details.**
3. **No re-entry to the stadium complex (red in map above) is allowed once a patron leaves this area after admission.**

HARVARD FOOTBALL TAILGATING POLICY 2009

In an effort to provide a safe and enjoyable atmosphere for all fans and spectators, Harvard Athletics, in cooperation with the Harvard University Police Department has established the following policies regarding tailgating within the Soldier Field Athletic Complex.

Harvard University is a great place to tailgate before a college football game, however tailgating rules are strictly enforced!

Guests who park within the athletic complex (gates 6, 14, 16 and 20) are welcome to tailgate at their vehicles. Tailgating, however, is not permitted for fans parking in the Harvard Business School parking lot.

All parking gates open two hours prior to kickoff for tailgating.

Access to Gate 6 prior to 2 hours before kickoff will be available to delivery vehicles, media members, event staff and Gate 6 pass holders only.

General Admission parking is available at Gate 14 on a first come, first serve basis for \$20/car. Each vehicle is permitted one parking space and the area directly behind the vehicle for tailgating. **You may not block aisles or other vehicles from parking and may be asked to dismantle any tables, chairs, tents, etc that block access.** For larger groups and organized/catered tailgates, please refer to Harvard Football Hospitality or contact Taylor Shea at 617-495-4925.

Commercial vehicles (U-hauls), RV's, Winnebagos and trucks are not permitted in any parking facility. Corporate sampling, give-a-way, and promotional vehicles **MUST** have prior written permission by Harvard Athletic Marketing to enter any parking lot. Tailgating is limited to two hours before and two hours after each football game. There will be no tailgating after the night game Friday, Sept. 25 at 7 p.m. Ticket holders will be asked to move into the game at kickoff. Non-ticket holders will be asked to leave the premises.

Beer kegs and items that promote the rapid consumption of alcohol are not permitted at any University athletic function or event. No individual or group may transport a keg to a University athletic event.

Grills using charcoal are prohibited within the athletic complex. The maximum propane gas cylinder size allowed will be 20 pounds.

No re-entry is allowed once you leave Harvard Stadium ticketed area (see map).

Alcohol Policy

Harvard University does not permit kegs at any University athletic function or event. Vehicles and/or fans carrying amounts of alcohol above State Law will **NOT** be allowed within the complex. Unruly or visibly intoxicated behavior will be grounds for removal.

Recycling Policy

Harvard uses Single Stream Recycling, so all cans, bottles, paper and cardboard may go in the same bag (this includes solo cups and plastics #1-7). Recycling and trash bins will be located under the stadium and in the concession area: please place all recycling in the blue bag and all trash in the black bag.

Fan Code of Conduct

Harvard Athletics encourages and promotes good sportsmanship by student-athletes, coaches and spectators. We request your cooperation by supporting the participants, coaches, officials, and fellow spectators in a positive, respectful manner. Our goal is to create a first-class environment to lend support to our teams while maintaining a safe and fun atmosphere for all. Fans engaging in inappropriate behavior including using foul language or engaging in negative verbal attacks on players, officials, coaches, or other fans may be asked to leave by security personnel.
