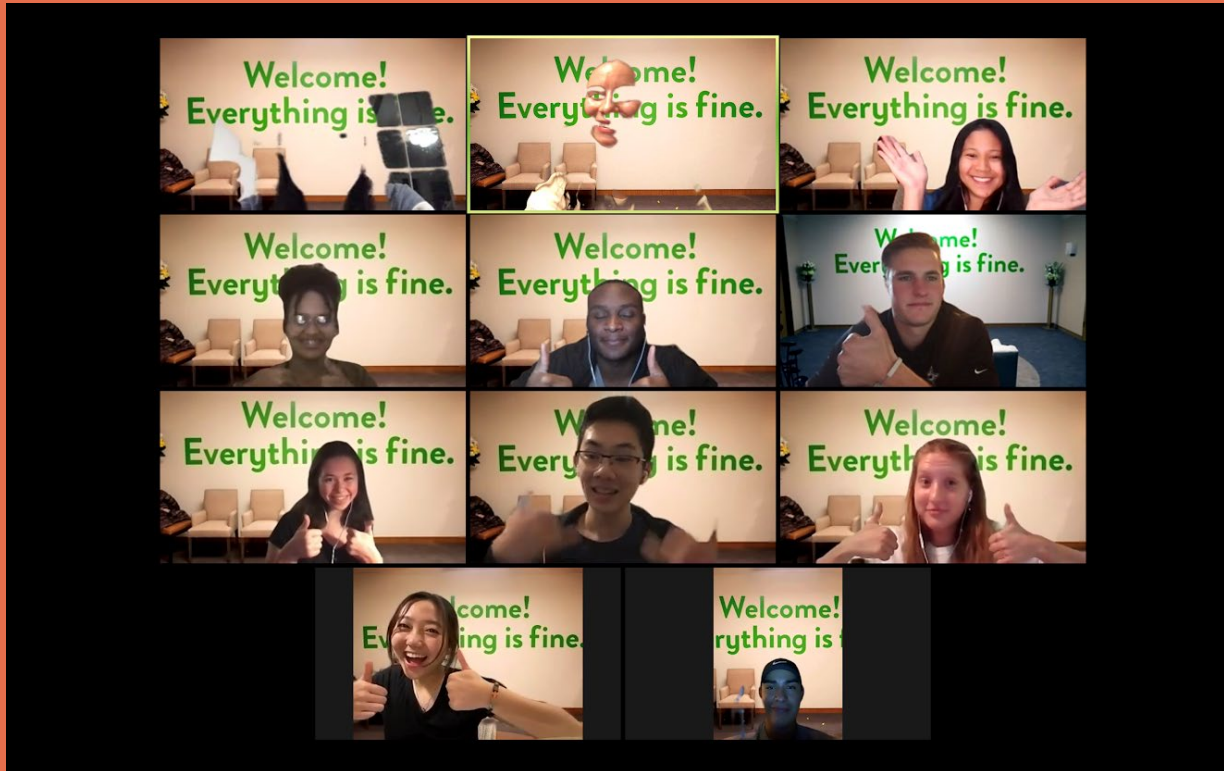

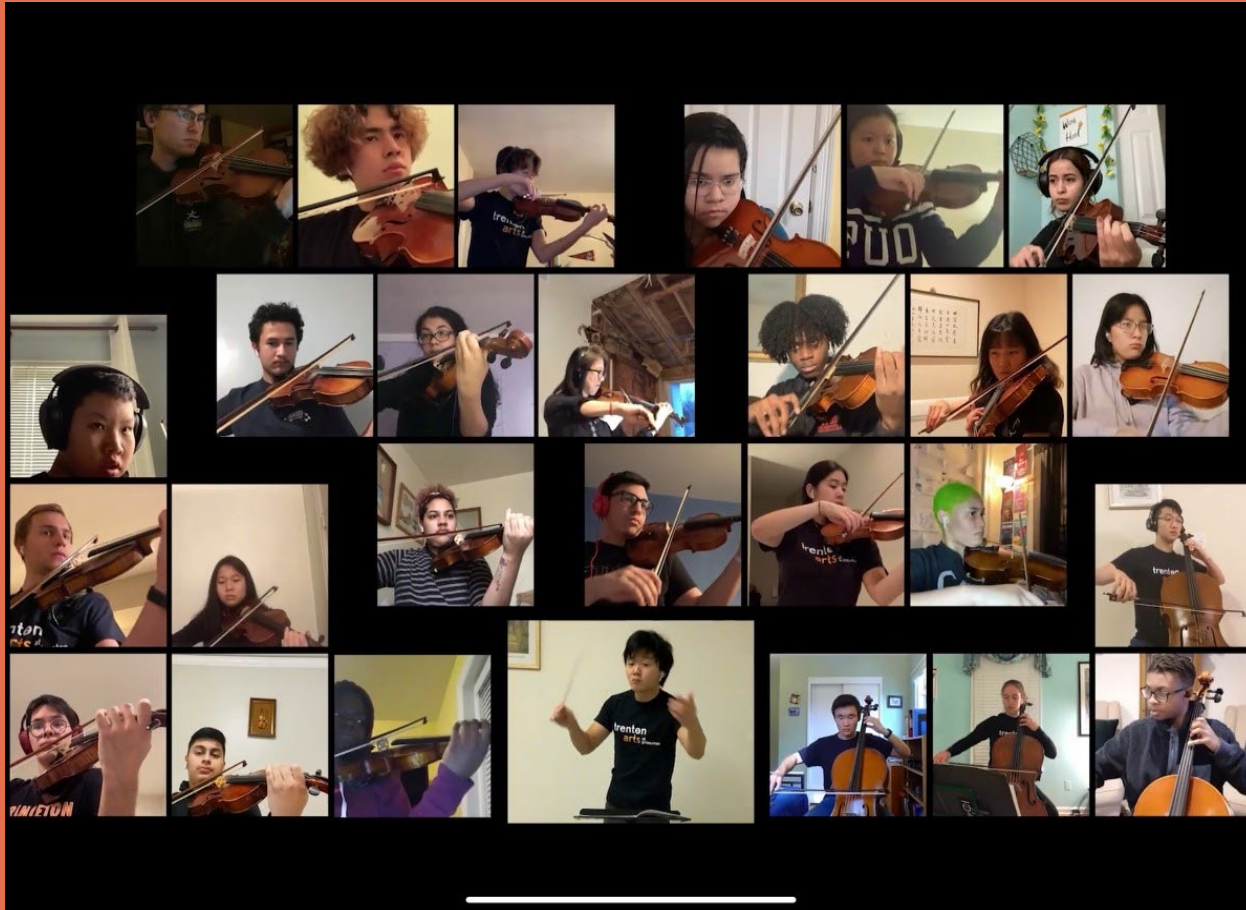


The **PURPOSE** of the Pace Center is to make service and civic engagement a central part of the Princeton student experience so that students can respond to the needs of the world in responsible ways.

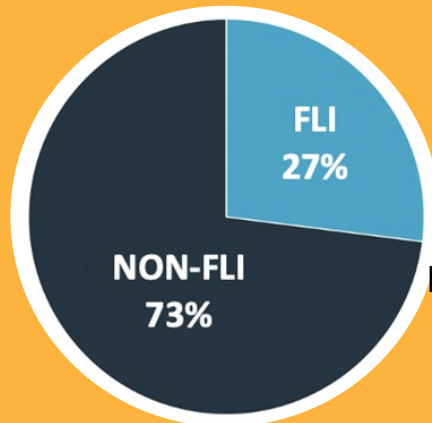
2020 PICS student profile



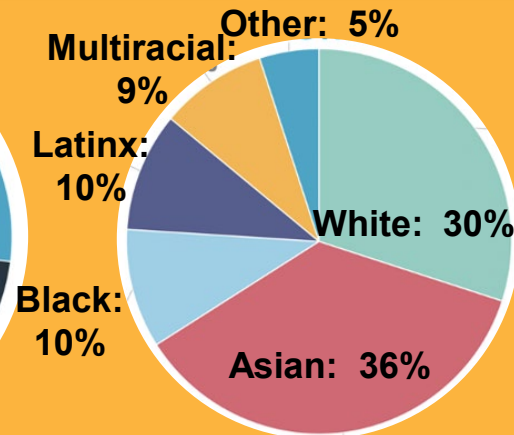
Class Year

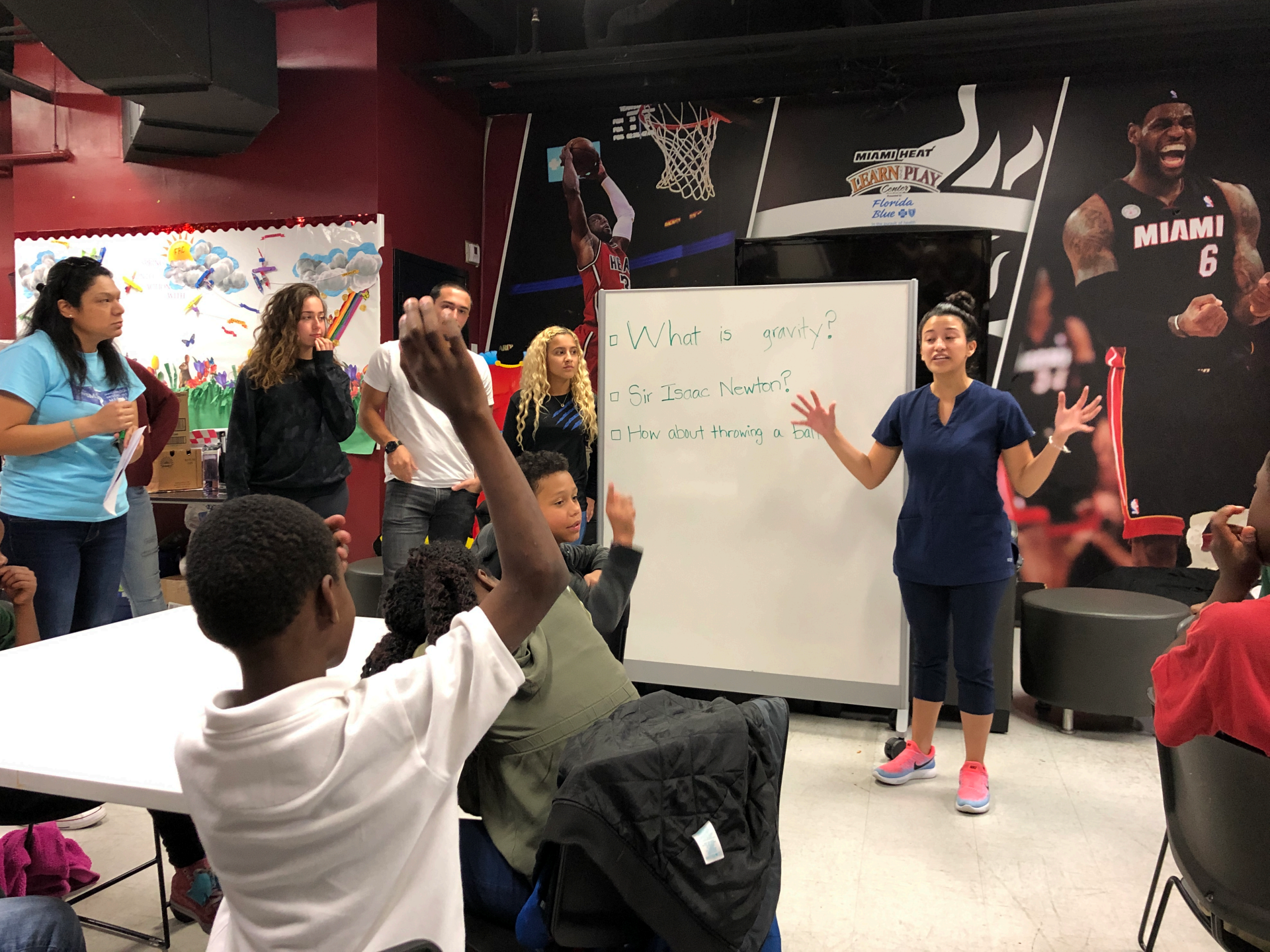

What to look for in a service project:

- Hands-on activity (it's possible, even now!)
- Community impact
- Bringing Tigers together
- Demonstrating Princeton's commitment to service (locally, not just globally)
- Sustainability
- Safety (what can be done remotely?)



What you can do now:

- Organize a collection (vital food, clothing & supplies)
- Safe, socially-distanced clean-ups
- Virtual education programming
- Initiate and foster a community organization partnership
- Lay the groundwork for school mentoring
- Host a virtual workshop
- Virtual fundraising (with an eye to the future)
- Identify your regional CS cheerleaders!
