Begin this Princeton-exclusive journey in historic Windsor, then travel to Austen's home in Chawton, a quaint village of rose-covered cottages, where she wrote many of her published works. Stay six nights at the five-star Macdonald Bath Spa Hotel, a short walk from the historic Roman Baths. In this UNESCO World Heritage-designated town, take a Jane Austen-themed walking tour and visit the Jane Austen Centre, featuring a delightful "Tea with Mr. Darcy."

Over the coming days, explore the stunning architecture of Wilton House and Bowood House, filming locations for Jane Austen film and TV adaptations, and stroll amid their acres of beautiful parkland. In Lyme Regis, where *Persuasion* is partially set, follow in Austen's footsteps at the famous breakwater and Lyme Bay.

End the journey in Winchester with its awe-inspiring cathedral and visit to Jane Austen's tomb. Along the way, discover some of the south of England's iconic sights, including Salisbury Cathedral, which boasts the tallest spire in Britain, and the charming streets of medieval Castle Combe, dubbed one of the most beautiful villages in England.

Traveling with you is preeminent Jane Austen scholar Claudia L. Johnson *81, who will offer a series of lectures and informal discussions bringing Jane Austen's world to life.



Itinerary

THURSDAY – FRIDAY, JUNE 5 – 6 HOME/WINDSOR, U.K.

Depart the U.S. on an overnight flight to London, U.K. Upon arrival at London Heathrow Airport, take a private transfer to the Macdonald Windsor Hotel, ideally located in the heart of Windsor. This evening gather for a welcome reception at the hotel.

SATURDAY, JUNE 7

CHAWTON HOUSE LIBRARY/ JANE AUSTEN HOUSE

After breakfast, travel to Chawton House, an Elizabethan manor that once belonged to Jane Austen's brother. It now accommodates a unique library of titles focusing on women's English literature from 1600 to 1860. Next, visit Jane Austen's House Museum, a charming cottage in Chawton where Austen spent the last eight years of her life and where she wrote, revised, and published six of her globally beloved novels. Here find an unparalleled collection of treasures that tell the story of Jane Austen and her family including paintings, jewelry, furniture, and household objects. Continue to Bath and check into the Macdonald Bath Spa Hotel, located a short walk from the center of Bath. Enjoy a relaxed dinner at the hotel this evening. Macdonald Bath Spa Hotel (B,L,D)

SUNDAY, JUNE 8

BATH

Jane Austen's home from 1801 to 1806, Bath has remained faithful to its Roman and Regency roots. After a morning lecture, embark on a guided Jane Austen-themed walking tour to view her former homes and landmarks that are featured in her work. Explore Sydney Gardens, a favorite spot of Jane Austen, the iconic Pulteney Bridge, the Pump Room, Queen Square, The Circus, and Gravel Walk. Visit No.1 Royal Crescent, a Georgian townhouse that creates a wonderful picture of life for both the wealthy and their servants in Georgian Bath. Finally, continue to the Jane Austen Centre, featuring a permanent exhibition that explores the effect living in Bath had on Jane Austen's life and writing. Enjoy a decadent "Tea with Mr. Darcy" in the Centre's Regency Tea Room. The remainder of the afternoon and evening is at leisure. Macdonald Bath Spa Hotel (B,L)

MONDAY, JUNE 9

SALISBURY/WILTON HOUSE

Travel by coach to Salisbury and take a guided tour of the city's exquisite medieval Salisbury Cathedral, boasting the tallest spire in Britain. Here discover over 750 years of history and view the well-preserved original 1215 Magna Carta document. After lunch join a guided tour at Wilton House, an excellent example of Palladian architecture. This impressive property has been a family home for over 450 years. Set in 21 acres of landscaped parkland, the house has also served as a filming location for the 2005 film adaptation of Jane Austen's Pride and Prejudice. Tonight enjoy free time and dinner independently. Macdonald Bath Spa Hotel (B,L)

TUESDAY, JUNE 10

BOWOOD HOUSE/ LACOCK ABBEY

Begin today with a guided tour of Bowood House, the family home of the Marquis and Marchioness of Lansdowne. This estate houses a unique collection of historical artifacts and family heirlooms spanning over 250 years, from Queen Victoria's wedding chair to Napoleon's death mask. Outside find 100 acres of beautiful parkland. Bowood was also used as a filming location for the 2007 TV film, Northanger Abbey. Mid-day walk the charming streets of Castle Combe and enjoy lunch independently. Continue to the village of Lacock for a tour of the centrallylocated Lacock Abbey, boasting golden stone cloisters and a Great Hall. Once a medieval nunnery, the Abbey became the family home of William Henry Fox Talbot, the inventor of the first photographic negative. This evening, dine at a local restaurant in Bath.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 11

WELLS AND WELLS CATHEDRAL

Following the final lecture of the educational program, depart for Wells, located at the foot of the rolling green Mendip Hills. The name "Wells" derives from the many springs rising near its magnificent 12th century cathedral, which dominates the city. Stroll the narrow cobblestone streets with rows of shops displaying Georgian fronts, then enjoy a guided tour of the Wells Cathedral followed by lunch at a traditional British pub. Return to Bath with the late afternoon and evening at leisure.

THURSDAY, JUNE 12

LYME REGIS

Travel to Lyme Regis, where *Persuasion* is partially set, and follow in Jane Austen's footsteps at the Breakwater, The Cobb, and Lyme Bay on a guided walking tour. Visit the

FRIDAY, JUNE 13

WINCHESTER CATHEDRAL AND WINDSOR

Arrive at the medieval city and former royal capital of Winchester for a guided tour. The awe-inspiring cathedral is a historic highlight as its hidden treasures include the tomb of Jane Austen and the Winchester Bible, one of the finest 12th-century bibles to have survived. After the tour, enjoy free time to shop, explore, and have lunch in town independently. Transfer back to Windsor, and check in to the MacDonald Windsor Hotel. Gather this evening for a private farewell dinner cruise on the Thames River.

Claudia L. Johnson *81 joined the faculty at Princeton in 1994 and was Chair of the English Department from 2004-2012. She specializes in eighteenth- and early nineteenth-century literature, with a particular emphasis on the novel.

In addition to eighteenth-century courses, she teaches courses on gothic fiction, sentimentality and melodrama, the history of prose style, film adaptations of novels into film, detective fiction, Samuel Johnson, and, of course, Jane Austen. In addition, she has strong research interests in eighteenth-century music and culture, in the idea of voice,

in letterpress printing, in Yiddish story, in the American Songbook of the 1930's and 1940s, and in international modernism.

Johnson's <u>Jane Austen's Cults and Cultures</u> (Chicago, 2012) won the Christian Gauss Award in 2013. More recently she has published a deluxe edition of <u>Jane Austen's The Beautifull Cassandra</u> (Princeton, 2018) in collaboration with artist Leon Steinmetz, and 30 <u>Great Myths about Jane Austen</u> (Blackwell, 2020) in collaboration with Clara Tuite. Her other books include <u>The Blackwell Companion to Jane Austen</u>, ed. with Clara Tuite (Blackwell, 2005), <u>The Cambridge Companion to Mary Wollstonecraft</u> (Cambridge, 2002), <u>Equivocal Beings: Politics, Gender and Sentimentality in the 1790s</u> (Chicago, 1995), which won an Honorable Mention for the MLA Lowell Prize, and <u>Jane Austen: Women, Politics, and the Novel</u> (Chicago, 1988). In addition she is keenly interested in textual scholarship, and has prepared editions of Jane Austen's <u>Mansfield Park, Sense and Sensibility, Northanger Abbey</u> and (with Susan Wolfson) Pride and Prejudice. Her research has been supported by major fellowships such as the NEH and the Guggenheim.

At present Johnson is working on the Regency diarist Anne Lister and on women and the invention of international modernism.

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
