DEAR PRINCETONIAN,

Traverse the magnificent landscapes, ancient settlements, and idyllic villages of Scotland and Norway on a cruise from Aberdeen to Oslo, with stops at the Shetland Islands and some of Norway's most celebrated fjords. Under the summer's Midnight Sun, long northern days illuminate snowcapped peaks, glittering glaciers, cascading waterfalls, and fjords framed by bright green valleys.

Begin with an overnight in historic Aberdeen, then board the 59-cabin *Hebridean Sky* and set out for the Shetland Islands, where prehistoric remains and Norse heritage endure at the remarkable Jarlshof archaeological site. Set sail for Norway and its breathtaking fjords, witnessing the unparalleled natural beauty of Sognefjord, Hardangerfjord, and Lysefjorden beneath the iconic flat-topped cliff of Preikestolen.

Step ashore at peaceful seaside towns and villages including the picturesque Ålesund, celebrated for its fairytale Art Nouveau architecture, and Bygstad, a more remote Fjordland community framed by pastures, farms, and majestic mountains. Equally compelling are the extraordinary wildlife viewing opportunities throughout this voyage; spot charismatic puffins, minke whales, porpoises, and seals as you cruise the beautiful coastal waters.

During this co-sponsored program, Princeton travelers will be joined by those from Harvard University, the World Affairs Council, and Archaeological Institute of America. HIGHLIGHTS

LINGER in Norway's most beautiful fjords including **Sognefjord**, Norway's longest, **Hardangerfjord**, the Queen of fjords, and **Lysefjorden** beneath **Preikestolen** (Pulpit Rock).

UNCOVER layers of ancient history with visits to Scotland's mysterious **Pictish Stones**, the **Viking ruins of Jarlshof** in the Shetland Islands, Stavanger's world renowned **Archaeological Museum**, and the **Hoperstad Stave Church**, one of the oldest in Norway.

WATCH for **extraordinary wildlife** — puffins, gannets, and sea eagles overhead, and minke whales, porpoises, and seals in the waters of Norway's southern fjords in summer.

DISCOVER Loen's **Kjenndal Valley**, with sweeping glacier views, serene lake crossings, and a breathtaking ride on the **Loen Skylift**.

EXPLORE the valleys and farms of **Sunnfjord**, a quieter, more intimate fjord experience, and connect with local life during a day in **Bygstad**, a remote community at the innermost point of the fjord.

CALL ON Rosendal for an opportunity to walk in **beautiful Hatteberg Valley** or take in the icy magic of **Folgefonna Glacier**.

STEP ASHORE at **peaceful, picturesque towns**, fishing villages, and farms off the beaten track—splendid **Art Nouveau Ålesund**, set on a cluster of coastal islands, and charming **Lillesand**, for its picturesque collection of traditional, white-painted wooden houses.

CONCLUDE in **Oslo** with the option to extend your journey at the **Grand Hotel**, annual venue of the Nobel Peace Prize ceremony, to explore Oslo's vibrant city center, Vigeland Sculpture Park, and Bygdøy Peninsula museums.

Tuesday, June 29 - Wednesday, June 30

DEPART HOME / ABERDEEN, SCOTLAND

Depart the U.S. on overnight flights to Aberdeen, Scotland. Arrive in Scotland's historic "Granite City" and transfer to your centrally located hotel. In the evening, gather with fellow travelers for a festive welcome orientation and reception.

Thursday, July 1

ABERDEEN, SCOTLAND

Spend the morning exploring **Old Aberdeen**, including **St. Machar's Cathedral**, or take an excursion along the **Pictish Stones Trail** to see intricately carved relics of Scotland's ancient people. Enjoy a traditional Scottish lunch before embarking your ship and setting sail in the evening toward Norway. *Hebridean Sky (B,L,D)*

Friday, July 2

LERWICK, SHETLAND ISLANDS, SCOTLAND

Arrive this morning in **Lerwick, capital of the Shetland Islands**, to explore its lively harbor and Norse heritage. Visit nearby **Jarlshof**, an extraordinary archaeological site spanning 4,000 years from ancient dwellings to Viking longhouses. Gather this evening for the Captain's welcome reception and dinner. *Hebridean Sky (B,L,D)*

Saturday, July 3

VIK, SOGNEFJORD, NORWAY

Wake this morning in Norway, cruising majestic **Sognefjord**, the country's largest and deepest fjord. Come ashore in the village of Vik to visit the ornate **Hopperstad Stave Church**, the 12th-century **Hove Stone Church**, and the **ancient Mohaugane burial mounds**. Sample "**gamal ost**," a traditional **Viking-era cheese**, still crafted locally, before spending the afternoon on deck sailing through dramatic fjord scenery and enjoying the lecture series. *Hebridean Sky (B,L,D)*

Sunday, July 4

ÅLESUND NORWAY

Spend a relaxing morning cruising as the lecture series continues. Following lunch onboard, spend the afternoon in **Ålesund**, one of Scandinavia's most picturesque towns. Choose from three optional excursions: **1.** a visit to a historic World War II bunker carved into the mountain above the city; **2.** a coach tour through the scenic Giske Islands; or **3.** an in-depth guided walking tour of the city, including Mt. Aksla. *Hebridean Sky (B,L,D)*

Monday, July 5

LOEN, NORWAY

Disembark in the beautiful village of Loen for a drive through the dramatic **Kjenndal Valley** and boat ride across **Loen Lake**, surrounded by towering peaks and glacier arms. Enjoy homemade waffles at **Kjenndalsbre Fjellstove** before continuing to the **Kjenndalsbre Glacier** viewpoint, an arm of the mighty **Jostedal Glacier**. Return to Loen for a free afternoon to explore independently before an evening sail through Nordfjord. *Hebridean Sky (B,L,D)*

Tuesday, July 6

BYGSTAD, NORWAY

Our lecture series continues this morning while cruising to Bygstad, a remote community where ships seldom venture and home to the hidden gem of **Sunnifjord**. Come ashore for a guided valley walk past cascading waterfalls, emerald pastures, and



idyllic farms framed by steep mountains. Visit **local homesteads** to learn about the daily life and enduring traditions of this fjordland community. *Hebridean Sky* (B,L,D)

Wednesday, July 7

ROSENDAL, NORWAY

Choose from a variety of excursions today: visit the elegant **Baroniet Rosendal**, Scandinavia's only Renaissance-era manor, where formal gardens and aristocratic history reveal Norway's ties to continental Europe; discover the power of ice at the **Folgefonna Glacier & Nature Center**, offering insight into Norway's dramatic glacial landscapes; or hike the scenic Hatteberg Valley, surrounded by waterfalls, forests, and soaring mountains. *Hebridean Sky* (B,L,D)

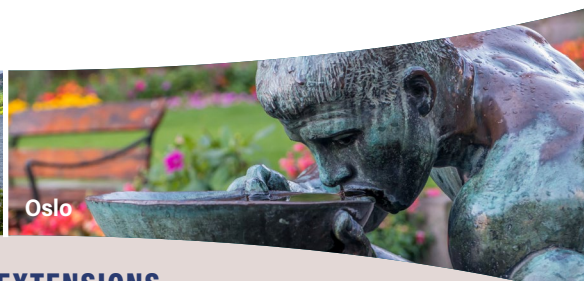
Thursday, July 8

HARDANGERFJORD, QUEEN OF THE FJORDS

Arrive in **Hardangerfjord**, one of Norway's most celebrated fjords, for its breathtaking combination of snow-crowned peaks, thundering waterfalls, and fertile orchards. Disembark in the traditional **village of Eidfjord** with the chance to visit **Hardangervidda Nature Center** and the roaring **Vøringsfossen Waterfall**, one of Norway's most spectacular. *Hebridean Sky* (B,L,D)

THE SCOTTISH HIGHLANDS

Wander through an estate hailed by David Attenborough as "one of the glories of wild Scotland," and stroll the grounds of Balmoral Castle, home of the Royal Family since the 1800s.

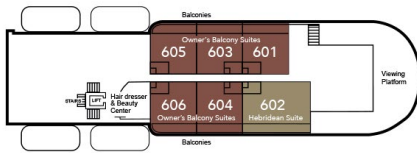

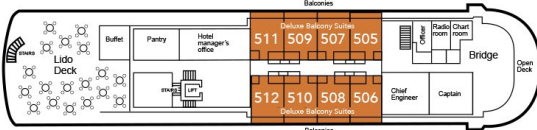
HEBRIDEAN SKY

The *Hebridean Sky* has 59 exceptionally spacious and well-designed suites. Each suite has ocean views, and several suites have private balconies. All suites feature a sitting room, ensuite bathroom, flat screened TV, spacious wardrobes, a dressing table, and beds that can be configured as twins or a double. After a major refurbishment in 2016, and further enhancements since, the *Hebridean Sky* now boasts beautifully designed public spaces including a large lounge, elegant club and bar with piano, library, and two outdoor seating areas. An elevator services all passenger cabin decks. Onboard chefs prepare international and regional cuisine served at a single open seating in the Restaurant or on the Lido Deck, weather permitting. A friendly crew provides exceptional service with a 1:2 crew to passenger ratio. The ship features advanced satellite navigation and communication equipment, roll stabilizers, and a fleet of Zodiacs to access remote shorelines and islands.

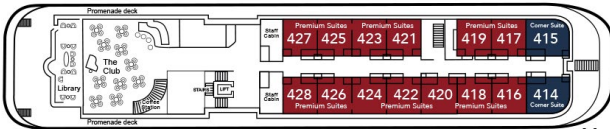

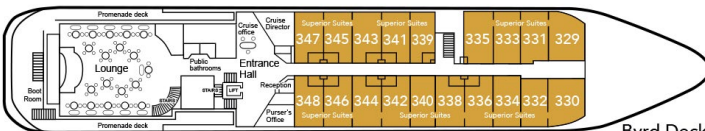

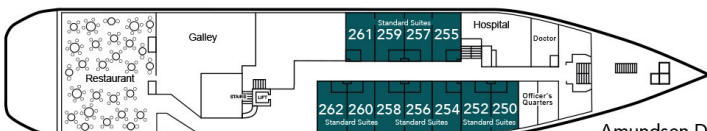
Scott Deck

WHAT TO EXPECT

This is a moderately strenuous program, at times physically demanding and busy, with considerable walking at some sites over cobblestone, hills, and uneven terrain. Hiking options are available in some ports, with distances of up to three miles. In some instances, elevators are unavailable, and stairs may not have handrails. You will need to climb into and out of Zodiacs for several excursions ashore—and there may be additional use of the Zodiacs to take advantage of opportunities that arise. Participants should be fit and in active good health. Limited medical facilities are available on-board *Hebridean Sky*. All participants will be required to follow safety protocols set forth by Criterion Travel, local staff, and host country laws.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

Travel insurance for trip cancellation and interruption, medical problems, baggage loss and delay, etc., is highly recommended. Trip cancellation policies that apply to this expedition are included in this brochure. Information about travel insurance will be sent to confirmed participants.

GROUP SIZE

This program can accommodate 96 participants, including travelers from Princeton Journeys, Harvard Alumni Travels, Archaeological Institute of America, and World Affairs Council.

A NOTE ABOUT RATES

Tour rates are based upon current fuel prices, currency values, taxes, tariffs, and a minimum number of participants.
